GINP: distribution of applications and grants 2022 og 2023

- Total budget pr. year: EUR 2 million. 2024 call was announced last week with a deadline on 18 June 2024.
- The program gives selected Danish science and innovation stakeholders the opportunity to reach out and form networks with international partners in a number of countries outside the EU.
- Korea is a prioritized country
- The activities under the grants should increase collaboration in a specific area with significant innovation potential.
- The supported networks must be of value for a broader set of stakeholders in Denmark.

- Establishment of **new networks** with relevant international partners.
- Strengthening of **existing and well established** international networks.
 - Base for long term cooperation
 - Access to international knowledge
 - Development of innovative and sustainable solutions to societal and global challenges
 - Provide added value for the applicant(s), the partner(s) and other stakeholders in Denmark



Who (in Denmark)?

- Research and Technology Organizations (RTO, in Danish "GTS-institutter")
 - National Cluster Organizations (in Danish "nationale klyngeorganisationer")
 - Individual Departments at Universities (in Danish 'institutter')
 - Publicly owned hospitals with research under the five regions
 - Other Higher Educations Institutions with research under the Ministry of Higher Education and Science
 - Other government funded institutions with research under a Ministry of the Government of Denmark
- ***Preferably engagement of several Danish stakeholders in one application***



What (activities)?

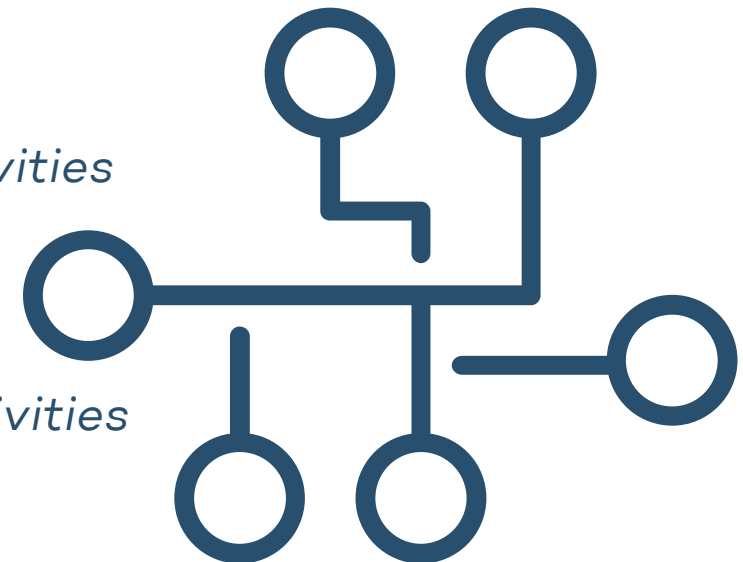
- Open for networking activities within all scientific, innovation and technological areas and fields (TRL 3-7).
- Prioritised areas are:
 - o The green transition in Denmark and worldwide
 - o Denmark's national positions of strength within health and life science
 - o Strategic research and innovation in digital and new, emerging technologies
- International networking activities:
 - o Workshops, seminars, conferences
 - o Delegation visits
 - o Summer/winter schools
 - o Training programs
 - o Long term stay(s)
- Grants up to 750.000 Danish kroner plus overhead

What (costs)

- The grant covers costs for both the applicant and the eligible partners.
- **Eligible costs:** travel, food and lodging, per diem, costs for rental of meeting and conference facilities and catering.
- **Ineligible costs:** acquisition of equipment/materials, salaries or any types of fees.
- **Overhead:** % of the total amount applied (depending on the applicant)
- **Co-financing/self-financing:** can be in kind or financial; double financing needs to be avoided

When?

- Publication of call: **March 11 2024**
- Application deadline: **June 18 2024**
- Selection Committee meeting September
- Decision in October/November
- Projects can start between January 1 and December 31, 2025
- Projects can have a maximum two year duration
